

### **Letter from the CEO**

Our biggest focus in 2019 has been **expanding capacity** for The Other Side Academy, so we can serve more people as they work to change their lives. We did this in three ways.

- 1. We **launched our second campus in Denver**, Colorado. Now, those in Colorado that are lost and caught in the vicious cycle of toxic and destructive behaviors can come sit on our second bench and learn how to change their lives for the better.
- 2. We **expanded our physical facilities in both cities.** In Salt Lake, we purchased the Avenues Senior Living Center that was directly adjacent to the Armstrong Mansion. This addition will allow us **to grow our population up to 150 students** as well as turn our apartment buildings into transitional housing for our graduates. In Denver, we were able to acquire the beautiful Parkside Mansion on York Street, directly across from the City Park. This facility, when remodeled, will **house up to 60 students.**
- 3. We **expanded our staff.** We were able to bring on two additional Delancey Street graduates, Beau Clark and Robert Davalos. We have been greatly enriched by their talent, their devotion, and their expertise. In 2019, we also hit a significant milestone in our progression. We were able to hire our own graduates as staff for the very first time. No longer are we only dependent upon hiring Delancey graduates, but we are now able to start growing our own future leadership.

We are so appreciative to the very generous donors that continue to help us expand our capacity so we can reach more of the most lost among us. We also acknowledge the significant in-kind support we receive from so many organizations, companies, and individuals. And we appreciate all those who have helped clear the path for us to operate and succeed.



In 2019, we continued to see **growth of our Salt Lake City moving company** as well as the **launch of The Other Side Movers in Denver** as well. The Other Side Movers Denver is receiving the same level of acclaim of exceptional service by their customers in Denver as The Other Side Movers has continued to receive in Salt Lake.

Our Thrift Boutique store, with its combination of great value in a clean, inviting environment and superior customer service along with the most charming, campiest sales videos you will find anywhere has led to such high demand that we are **announcing the launch of a second Thrift Boutique store in the Salt Lake Valley** that will launch in the beginning of 2020 in Millcreek, Utah!

We also continued to receive broad attention and coverage from media and community leaders. We have had the great privilege of having famed New York Times columnist and author David Brooks and notable author Anne Snyder visit us at our campus and then write about us in their books, "The Second Mountain: The Quest for a Moral Life" by David Brooks and "The Fabric of Character" by Anne Snyder.

While all of these advancements are exciting, the most important work has been the growth of our students and the success of our graduates. As of the end of 2019, we had **102 students in Salt Lake City and 11 in Denver.** At the end of 2019, we had **69 graduates** of The Other Side Academy and **70% of them were living Drug-Free, Crime-Free and Employed** lives.

# **About The Other Side Academy**

The Other Side Academy is a 2.5 year residential life skills and vocational training program for men and women determined to break their cycle of long-term criminal behaviors, substance abuse, dysfunction, and homelessness.

Ours is more than a school program. It's about giving determined individuals the opportunity to learn vocational, pro-social, and life skills essential to succeeding on "the other side." Students earn their GED, learn marketing skills, business skills, and gain experience in a variety of trades. Within our walls, lives are rebuilt by learning and keeping promises, choosing integrity, accountability, and honesty. Our students have opportunities to work in several vocational training schools; The Other Side Movers; The Other Side Thrift Boutique; The Other Side Builders.

The "students" represent society's most serious social problems - and yet, remarkably, as a group they provide solutions to one another's challenges. The Other Side Academy believes in restoring the human dignity of all people and accepts men and women ranging from 18 to 68 years of age without regard to race, gender, nationality, sexual orientation, or physical handicap. We accept applicants pre- and post-sentencing and from within the jails and prisons throughout Utah. We accept applicants pre- and post-sentencing and from within the jails and prisons in Utah, Colorado, and nearby states.

The Other Side Academy is a place for all adults wanting to make a better life for themselves and willing to put in the work necessary to confront and change lifelong patterns of destructive behavior. It's a place where they are taught, guided, and mentored by seasoned students and staff who have walked similar paths and have committed to changing their mindset, understandings, and behavior thus creating a new person ready to help others.

Our community believes "as A helps B, A gets better!" Honesty is at the core of everything we do and self-realization, radical candor-type correction, and patience with self and others pays off. The Other Side Academy is the place where the most lost among us can completely turn their lives around. Our thoughts influence our choices and determine our actions. For our graduates, reaching "the other side" is reality and success is defined as a life free from addiction, crime and destruction, to one full of honesty, empathy, and accountability.

### The Twelve Beliefs

1 You alone can do it, but you can't do it alone

We grow as we learn to connect with others. Community is the antidote to personal alienation. The way out is to let others in.

2 Make and keep promises

The primary requirement for entry to The Other Side Academy is a sincere desire to change. To change from the inside out we must learn a completely new set of habits and skills. We are here because we asked to come - and made a promise to do our best.

3 Self-reliance. There is no free lunch

We support ourselves – and keep our doors open for others who wish to change their lives by running businesses. It's pretty simple, if we don't work we don't eat.

4 Impeccable honesty

Many of us have lived both inside and outside of jails, prisons, and rehab programs. We have perfected the skills of lying, manipulating and using those around us. While at The Other Side Academy you will learn and be expected to practice impeccable honesty about your actions, thoughts and feelings.

5 Act as if

As self-discipline, hard work, and rigorous honesty become ingrained habits, feelings of self-worth, peace, and happiness take root and begin to grow. Until then, we "act as if" we are honest, caring, curious, and humble. Over time we become that which we habitually do.

6 Embrace humility

One of the most difficult gifts The Other Side Academy family gives us is feedback. Our job is to help others see the truth about their self. To be aware is to be alive. Humility accelerates awareness.



### The Twelve Beliefs



7 Each one teach one

Our primary focus is not ourselves, it's others. As we become instrumental in lifting and serving others, we discover a source of motivation, worth and satisfaction unlike any we've ever experienced. When A teaches B, A gets better. We improve our own lives when we focus on helping others.

8 200% accountability

Everyone at The Other Side Academy is accountable not only for our own actions, but to watch over those around us.

9 Forgiveness

It takes time and effort to rebuild our lives. If we feel wronged, we

1) speak out rather than act out or check out, 2) work on me first, you second, and 3) let go.

10 Boundaries

Setting and maintaining boundaries is the process through which we develop character. We set strong standards to strengthen the mental and emotional muscles needed to make critical personal change.

11 Faith friendly

We are supportive of any beliefs that help lead to a healthier and more connected life. We are not a 12--step program. We support our fellow students in worshipping or not worshipping according to our own principles and beliefs.

12 Pride in work

The way we live demonstrates the value we place on ourselves. You get back what you put in.

The best way to create a feeling of well-being is to do any job with joy and love.



## **Social Enterprises**

One of the most difficult life changes our students make is learning to re-engage, using healthy communication styles, with the people and community around them. To do so, we ask them to "Act As If." Over time, we believe that we can become that which we habitually do. The Other Side Academy provides real time opportunities every day, in which our students can practice healthy behaviors within the contexts of community living and consistent work life. We provide a variety of vocational training opportunities both on and off campus. Our current social enterprises, run entirely by students, are incredibly successful and consistently receive five-star reviews from customers; The Other Side Movers and The Other Side Thrift Boutique. Making new connections, understanding self, building personal and employable skill sets, and work experience are all part of rebuilding lives.

The Other Side Academy's vocational training components include culinary arts, accounting, business administration, corporate development, construction, warehouse management, retail sales, billing and bookkeeping, marketing and advertising.



# "I learned to put other's needs ahead of my own and grow into a man of integrity, honesty, determination and purpose"

This is my story....

I was raised by a single mom and was a rebellious, thrill-seeking kid without any respect for authority. I tested any and all boundaries and drifted into a life of drugs and crime during high school and into adulthood.


My anti-social tendencies and addiction to methamphetamines led to my first felony charges when I was 23 years old. This marked the beginning of quite a few years in and out of the prison system. I chose a life as a career criminal and drug dealer. These decisions cost me 11 years of incarceration and took an unimaginable toll on my family and community.

In 2016, I was facing a 15-year prison sentence and knew I had to change! I applied for an interview with The Other Side Academy. I was lucky and grateful to be accepted. When I first arrived at the Academy in Salt Lake City, I was stuck in an ex-convict mindset and spent many months battling old habits and behavior patterns. I came close to leaving the Other Side and almost threw away this opportunity to build a new me. My path become brighter when I chose to finish my two-year commitment to The Other Side Academy and stayed another two years voluntarily. I learned to take responsibility for my own behaviors; good and bad. I faced the damage my decisions and actions had caused my family and community. Most importantly, I learned to put other's needs ahead of my own and grow into a man of integrity, honesty, determination and purpose. Now, I thrive on helping put the world together rather than tearing it apart.

I graduated from The Other Side Academy and was hired to manage The Other Side Builders construction company and Property Management in 2019. I've worked hard to regain the trust and support of my family and community and value the opportunity to help other broken people do the same.
